




Plastic Pesticide Container Recycling Guidelines

- . Triple rinse or pressure rinse all containers when emptied. Remember, it is best to rinse containers immediately after they are emptied. Some pesticide residues solidify quickly, and ecome difficult to remove from the container if left in the jug.
- . Dispose of the Pesticide Caps and remove sleeves and labels from containers. The Pesticide Caps are made of different plastic material that cannot currently be recycled.
- . Each empty pesticide container returned will be inspected to ensure it has been properly rinsed. Inrinsed containers will not be accepted.

Oven-Fried Fish Fillets

- · I pound fish fillets
- · 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- ¼ cup shredded parmesan cheese
- ¼ teaspoon dill weed
- ¼ teaspoon salt
 ¼ teaspoon pepper
- * 2 cups cornflake-type cereal, crushed



Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Grease a 13x9 baking dish. Cut fillets into serving pieces, if necessary. In a small bowl, combine lemon juice and vegetable oil. In a separate small bowl, mix Parmesan cheese, dill weed, salt, and pepper. Dip each fillet into lemon juice mixture. Lay in baking dish, sprinkle with cheese mixture, and coat with crushed cereal. Bake uncovered for 20 to 30 minutes or until fish flakes easily.

Yield: 4 servings
